COFFEE AND CONVERSATION

Join us on Saturday, August 5th at 10am for a coffee-and-donut discussion for those interested in knowing more about advocacy with local School Boards. We will meet at the Midtown-Carnegie Library in the upstairs community room.

Several issues are arising that relate to League policy positions (for example, LGBTQIA+ issues, racial issues, book banning). League members can have powerful impact by voicing opinions. It is important to assure that members speak out as individuals, not as League members or on behalf of the League unless authorized to do so. Our discussion will cover these distinctions and some strategies for effective advocacy.

AUGUST 8 ELECTION DAY

Greene County: City of Springfield

Shall the City of Springfield, Missouri, impose an additional sales tax of three percent (3 percent) on the retail sale of adult use marijuana with proceeds from such tax to be used for public safety, mental health services, housing, and substance abuse service?

Webster County: City of Seymour

On August 8, the city of Seymour will place a half-cent sales tax for transportation on the ballot, which is estimated to generate around \$200,000 annually to improve the city's streets.

Election Information

Voter Registration Deadline for folks not previously registered to vote in Missouri was July 12, 2023.

Voter Registration for folks who are already registered in Missouri but move to a new voter jurisdiction (i.e., change counties) after the July deadline and provided you are still on file at your previous location ... go to your County Clerk's Office to change your address up to and including Election Day.

Voter Registration for folks who change addresses but remain in the same voting jurisdiction ... you can change your address at your polling location on Election Day.

Absentee voting for the August 8, 2023, election will begin June 27, 2023.

In-Person, no excuse Absentee voting begins two weeks before Election Day.

Polls open Election Day from 6:00AM – 7:00PM. To find your polling place in Greene County, go to vote.greenecountymo.gov/voting-information

If you live in Christian or Webster County, call your County Clerk's Office.

If you are registered, you can vote. Present one of the following valid government-issued photo IDs: current Missouri driver or non-driver license, U.S. Passport, military ID or other official state or federal photo ID. If you do not have a valid photo ID, you can vote a provisional ballot.

WOMEN'S EQUALITY DAY

Women's Equality Day will be recognized in the U.S. on August 26. It is a time to honor the sheroic efforts of those who endured violence and discrimination in order to win the right for women to vote. The 19th Amendment, passed in 1920, brought suffrage for most U.S. women. It was not, however, until the Snyder Act of 1924 that Indigenous citizens were guaranteed the right to vote, and not until civil rights legislation of the 1960s did Black citizens have the guarantee. On Women's Equality Day we should celebrate the advances, but also recognize recent efforts to turn back the clock on voting rights and women's rights in general.

Though the Constitution now guarantees women's suffrage, many other rights are vulnerable to judicial, legislative, or regulatory whim. The Equal Rights Amendment which would add constitutional protection for women's rights was introduced in 1923 but has been

stalled for 100 years. Representatives Kirsten Gillibrand and Cori Bush have recently introduced a joint resolution stating that the ERA has met ratification requirements and should be finalized as the 28th Amendment.
