Speaker Bio: Kayla Lewis, Ph.D., is a registered citizen of the Chickasaw Nation. She has been in education for over 25 years, with experience as a classroom teacher, Reading Recovery teacher, literacy coach, and university professor. She is an Associate Professor and the Interim

Director for the School of Special Education,
Leadership, and Professional Studies at Missouri State
University. Her research focuses on culturally authentic
Native American children's literature and Native
American content in school curriculum. In addition to
her work on campus, she currently serves as the vicechair of the board for the Southwest Missouri Indian
Center and as the president-elect of the Missouri
Association of Reading Recovery Educators. She is also
actively involved in the National Association of
Multicultural Education. Dr. Lewis has presented at
numerous state and national conferences and her tribe's
national women's conference, The Dynamic Women of
the Chickasaw Nation Conference.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE UPDATE

The next Education Committee meeting will be Wednesday, October 23 from 1:00-2:00 PM at the Schweitzer-Brentwood Library. Our committee remains concerned about increased incidents of book banning and censorship stories both locally and across the

country. An interactive map from the American Library Association displays <u>censorship attempts by each state from 2014-2023</u>, and PEN America provides a <u>searchable index of books banned in the 2022-2023 school year</u>. Type "Missouri" in the search bar to view the title and school districts where book censorship is happening in our state. Our October meeting will be devoted to studying library and censorship policies from other state leagues.

VOTER & ELECTION SERVICES UPDATE

September has been a busy month with registrars tabling registration events at various locations and voter education presentations made to several groups. The Voter's November issue will contain more details as the 2024 registration season slows its pace.
