² Education Committee Update

The last Education Committee Meeting prior to summer break will be Wednesday, May 7, 12:00-1:00 at the Brentwood Library. A few members are presenting our slides to the LWVMO delegates via Zoom on June 5 in the hopes of getting the following LWVNH education policy adopted via concurrence at the June 7 conference. We are planning on a trial run of our slides to check for clarity and timing, so this will be the primary topic of our May 7 meeting.

"LWVNH believes that parents who choose not to use the public schools do so of their own volition and that public funds should not be used to support homeschooling or private schools and academies, including religiously affiliated schools."

Why is this an issue? The MO House passed the governor's planned \$50 Million dollars of general revenue (taxpayer money!) to go toward the MoScholar Program (basically private school vouchers). Thankfully, the Senate rejected the funding and even voted to fully fund the public education foundation formula. Things still need to be negotiated, but that is good news so far.

ENVIRONMENT & SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE UPDATE

Several members of our committee enjoyed a presentation by Sarah Sims from the City of Springfield entitled "Recycle Right." We also enjoyed learning from Dr. Robb Jacobson's presentation, "The History of Conservation on the Lower Missouri River: A Long Strange Trip." Our trash pickup scheduled for April 6 had to be postponed due to weather. Our next trash pickup will be May 3, at 9:00 am. March 2025

LOCAL PROGRAM PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT TO THE BOARD, APRIL 28, 2025 Committee Members: Michele Breshears, Ann Elwell, Cindy Mueller

Our committee solicited input from members for changes to our Local League Public Policy **Positions (known as our "Program)** via the March General Meeting, April newsletter, and during the April 15-16 Unit meetings. Eleven individuals filled out notecards with suggestions. Nobody followed up with direct contact to our committee. Below is the tally of suggestions. The number represents how many times each subject was listed. As you can see, local campaign finance reform was mentioned several times. The board may want to recommend an update to our Campaign Finance position to include "local" campaign finance. Several topics deal with issues our committees are already addressing and taking action on. Several of the suggestions might be good topics for speakers next year.

Public Policy Short Form Update: The "Short Form" list of League policies (national, state, local) that guide our current work have been updated to reflect the 2024-26 *Impact on Issues* page numbers (instead of 2022-2024). Basically, this was just changing page numbers, although the national league did include a comment on book censorship that is now included. A similar update will have to be completed again after State League Convention when the state makes changes to the new Guide to State Action (and hopefully adds an education policy).

Our committee recommends waiting until July to post the 2025 updated "Short Form" versions to avoid confusion. This will also allow committee chairs to double check on policy changes/ additions/ deletions in their area.
