

# "Undivide Us" Documentary Screening

What happens when most Americans are silenced because they are too despondent or afraid to speak openly in schools or school board meetings, in college classrooms, in their communities, or at the family dinner table? Are we dangerously close to a tipping point where the extremes on the right and the left make it impossible for the peaceful coexistence of varying viewpoints?

So, what can we do about that? Let's have a community conversation and start talking with each other!

Join us for a screening of Undivide Us, a documentary about bridging the political divide, on Thursday, June 12 at 6:30pm at the Schweitzer Brentwood Library in Springfield (NOTE: The previously announced screening at the Alamo Drafthouse has been cancelled due to logistical reasons).

"Undivide Us is leading a movement of people to reclaim the nation's soul through open discourse, civic engagement, and self-governance. Our discussion will revolve around understanding how to diffuse toxic polarization, celebrate differences, and identify actions we can take to foster more community connections." - Undivide Us team

The League of Women Voters of Southwest Missouri and the Springfield-Greene County Library District have partnered to provide this documentary screening, It's a 1-hour documentary, followed by an audience Q&A and a panel discussion featuring Andrew Crocker, a political science instructor at OTC, and Nora Cox, a political communications instructor at MSU. The intent is to start not only a community conversation, but some personal reflection in our own lives, on what each of us can do to better understand the political divide and help bridge the gap, along with ideas on where to take the conversation from here.

# VOTER SERVICES & ELECTIONS COMMITTEE UPDATE

Voter registration events continue to occur, although at a slower pace than during a midterm or general election year. Two Naturalization events, one at Marshfield and the other at George Washington Carver National Monument, resulted in forty-seven new citizens registering to vote. The George Washington Carver event was tabled by the League of Women Voters of the Greater Joplin Area and the League of Women Voters of Southwest Missouri.

During Artfest 2025, league members maintained a voting booth so that folks attending Artsfest could vote on their favorite pieces of "live art" that were in the process of being created by artists in the Art Yard. Artsfest staff provided ballot boxes and voting tickets. We were able to remind folks, young and old, about the importance of voting. We also had voter registration supplies available. The Art Yard turned out to be popular and we were asked if the League would be interested in doing it next year.

We continue to be a presence at Harmony House and the O'Reilly Center for Hope.

Registration at the Farmers' Markets on Republic Road begins May 31 and we will be present at both Pridefest and Juneteenth.

Let me know if you see any opportunities for registration tabling. Information about the August 5 and November 4 elections is slow in coming and folks are not thinking about voting. That could change if the Governor decides to put the Abortion Amendment on the ballot this year as opposed to leaving in on the ballot in 2026.


- The Juneteenth Celebration at Silver Springs Park, Friday, June 20, 5 p.m., includes the unveiling of a newly renovated pavilion.
